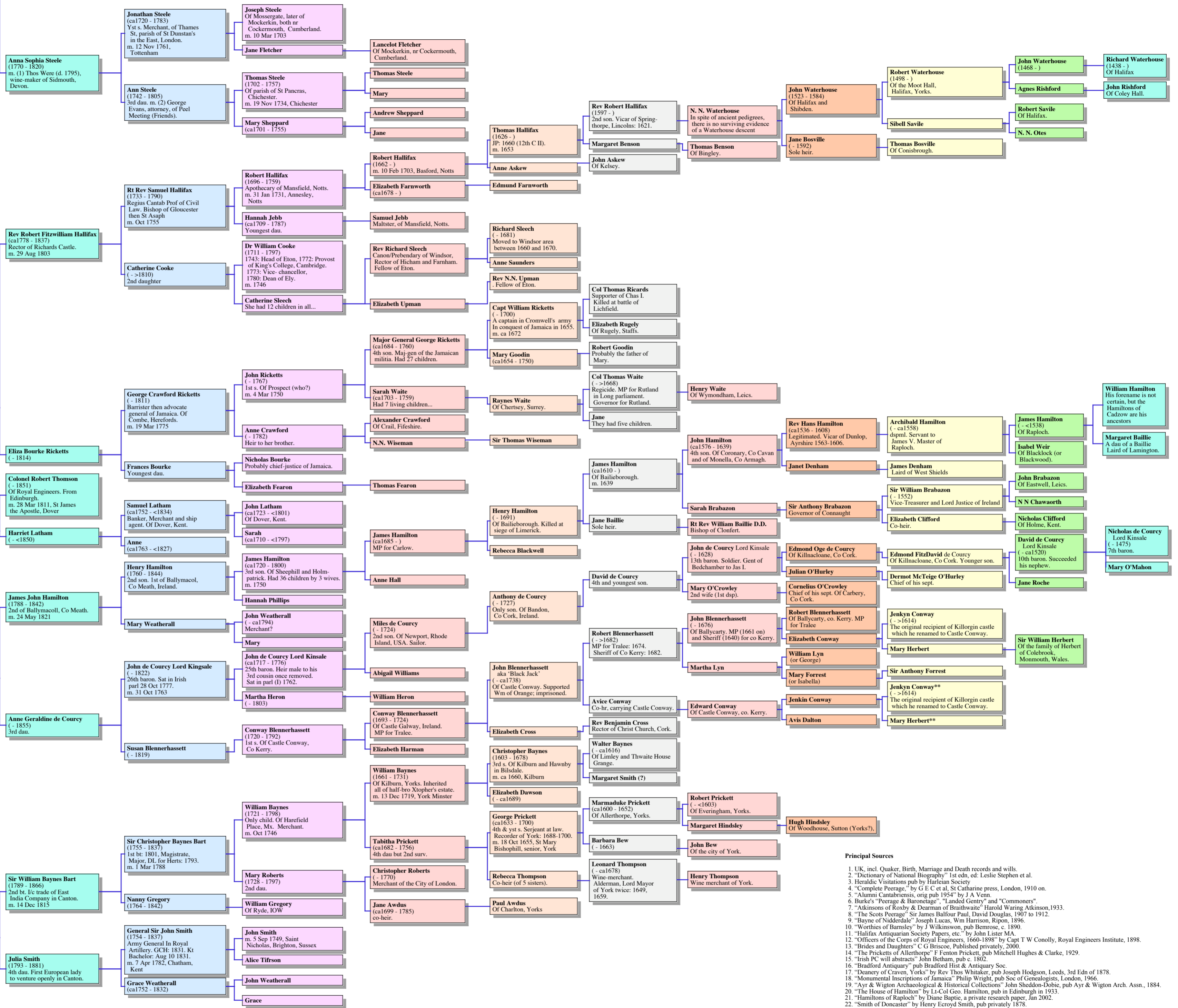

- Guy Ferrand's arms:**
- Argent a cinquefoil gules and on a chief gules two crosses flory vair. (Ferrand)
 - Gules a two headed eagle or displayed, on a chief enarched ermine a rose gules between two martlets sable. (Atkinson)
 - Argent on a chevron gules five goutte d'eau between three fleur-de-lis vert with a saltire for difference (Busfield, but these arms are not those of his grandfather's but those granted to an uncle in the late 19th century.)
 - Ferrand.
 - Azure on a chevron ermine between 3 hedges and in the centre chief point a bundle of reeds erect or, bended vert, three ears of wheat slipped of the last. (Harris)
 - Ferrand.
