Waterhouse of Thornes.

This family is proved to be connected with those of Shibden by the will of Philip Waterhouse of Overthorpe 1614, who leaves to Robert Waterhouse, son of my Cousin Robert, of Wakefield, & he appoints one of his supervisors, Robert Waterhouse of Wakefield, mercer, if he survive me, if not, his brother John Waterhouse of Thornes.

The Cousinship might, however, arise from the marriage of the families, as if it originated in the male descent it must have been remote; the nearest it could have been would have been that their great-grandfathers were brothers.

John W. of Southowram gives a white horse for his Corspresent. Two priests to pray for his soul & his friends' souls. Residue to his father, whom he makes Executor, & commits his wife & children to him. Witnesses, Richard W., his brother, John Blakeden, Vicar of Greynsley, & W^m Anderton, mine host.

There is no proof that Richard was son of Edward.

The relationship of this family to those of Shibden Hall appears from a clause in the will of Tho^s Waterhouse of Braithwell 17 May 40 Eliz.: "I give to the Right Hon. the Lord Darcie for a remembrance a case of Pistols which were lately given me by my cousin Isaac Waterhouse;" which Isaac must have been he of Woodhouse, as there were no others of the name. On recollections there was another Isaac at the time. See below [page 853].

A Robert Waterhouse of Headon made his will in 1616; mentions his wife Catherine & son Robert, & again Robert W. of Headon 1617 names Ann his wife, Robert, Mark, John, Grace, Ann, Alice, & Susan, wife of John Blades, his children.

An Edward W. of Skircote, who was probably of this family, made his will 7 June 1743; names Joan his wife, Edward, James, Nicholas, Isabel, Joan, & Sibil his children; names John Waterhouse, late of Newhouse; Edmund W. as a witness.

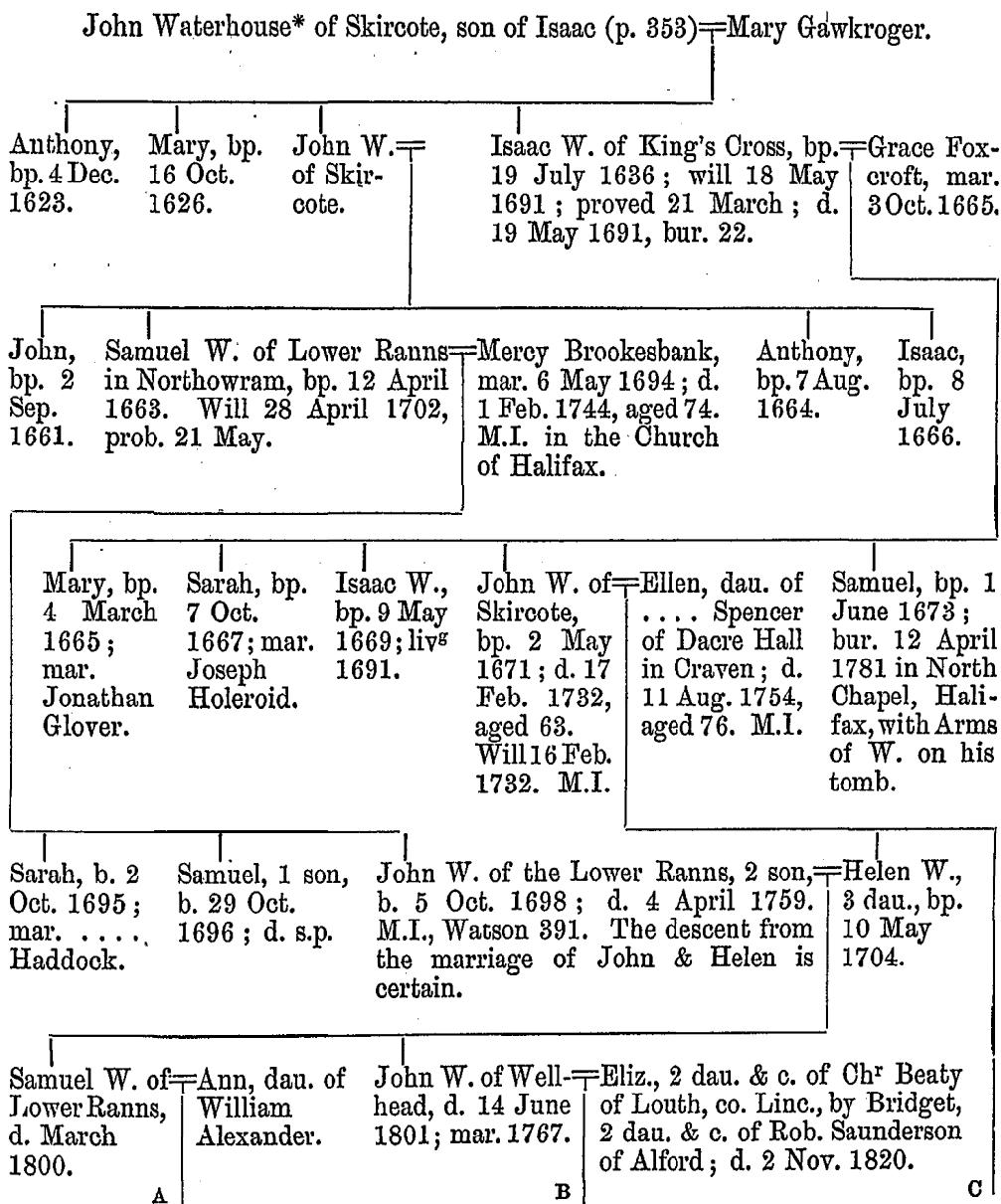

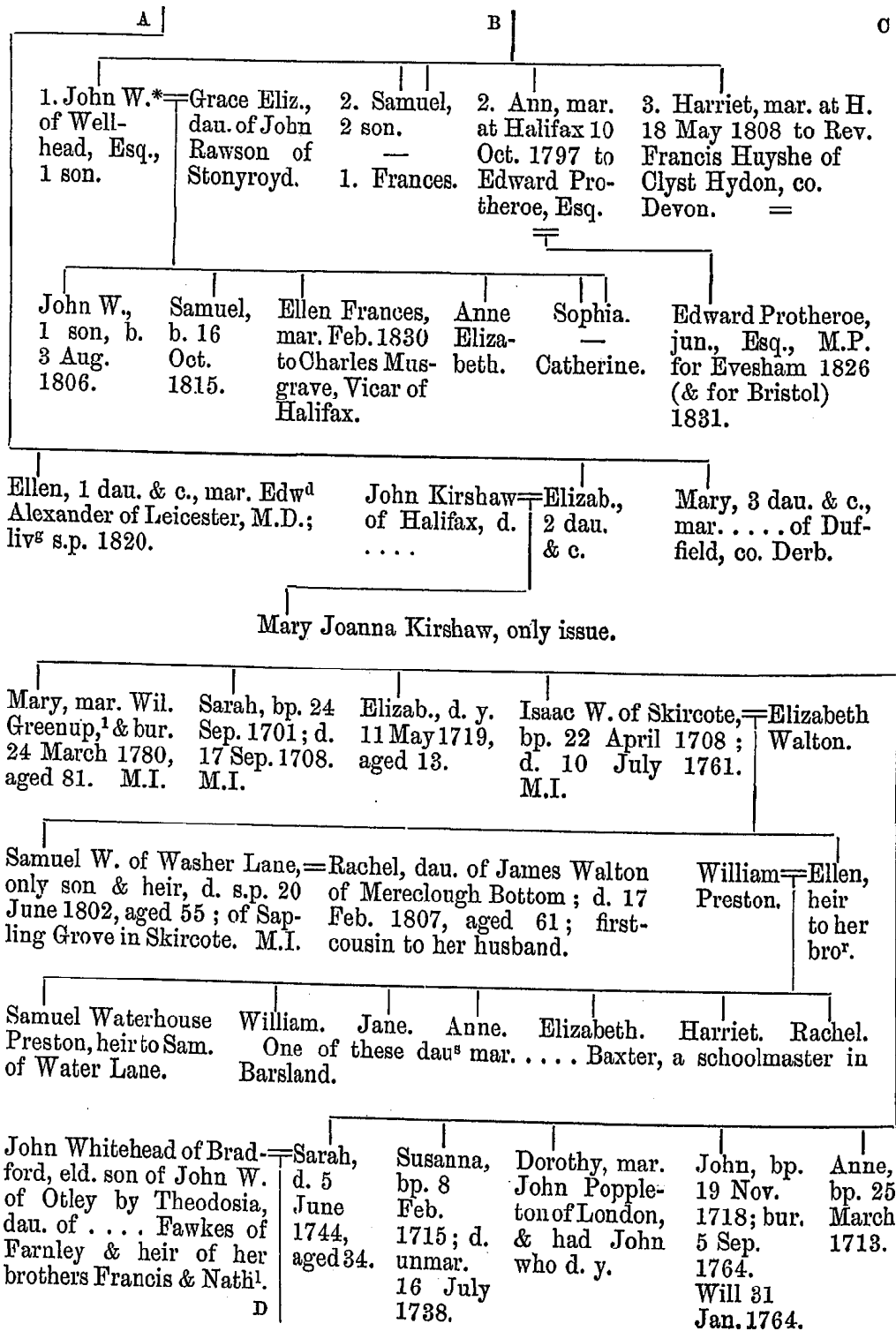
Waterhouse of Well Head.

The marriage of Whitehead & Fawkes I think very dubious.

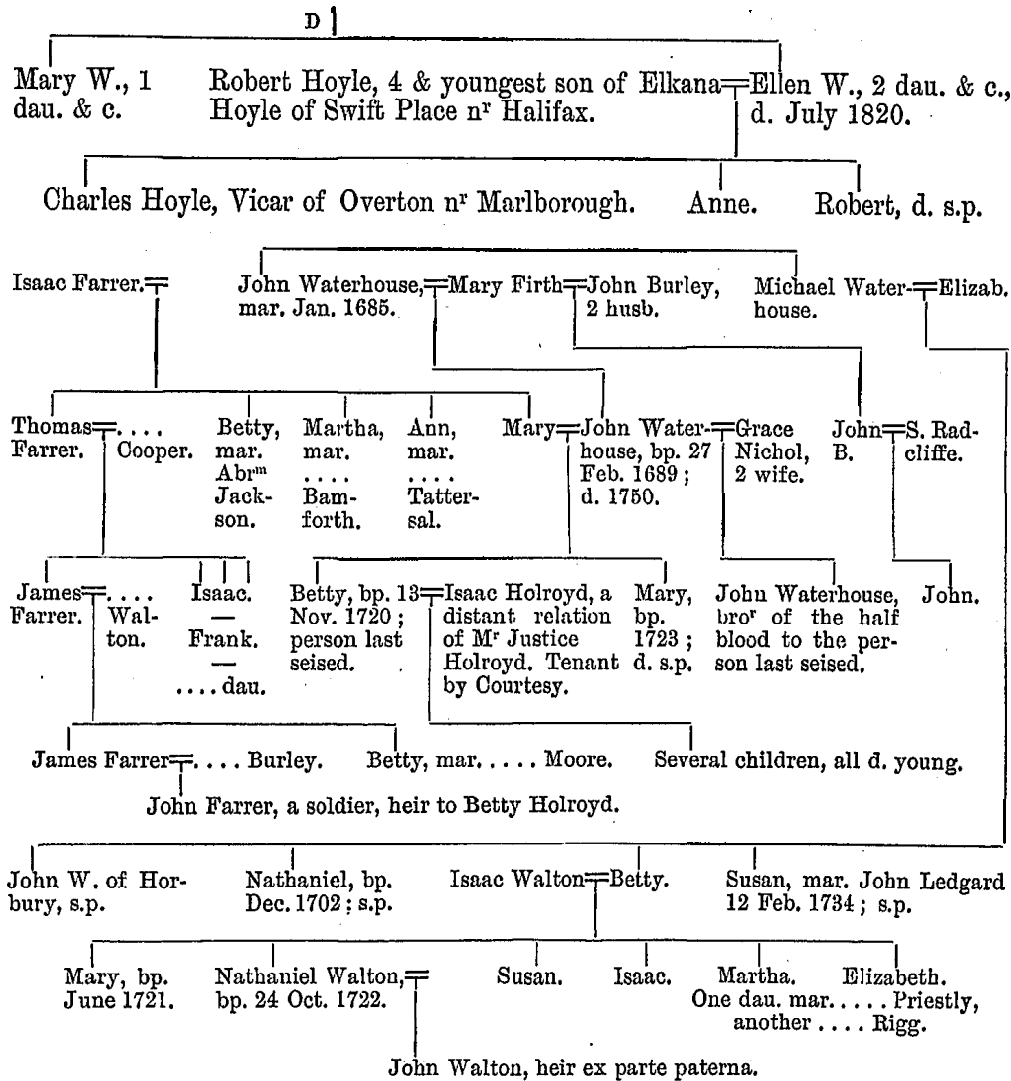
