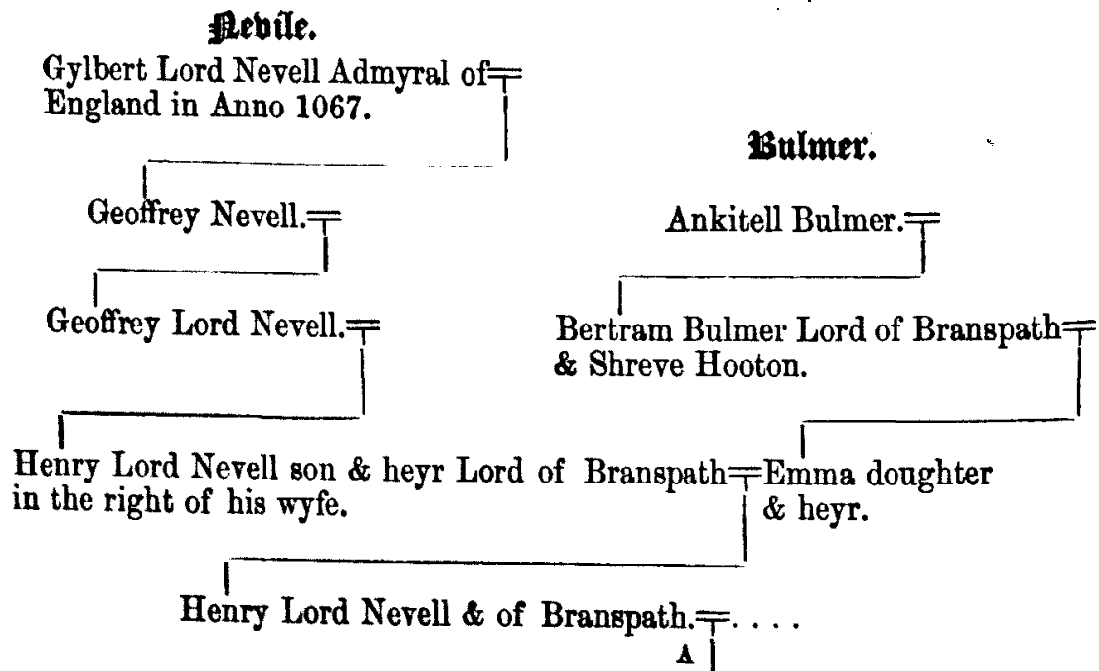

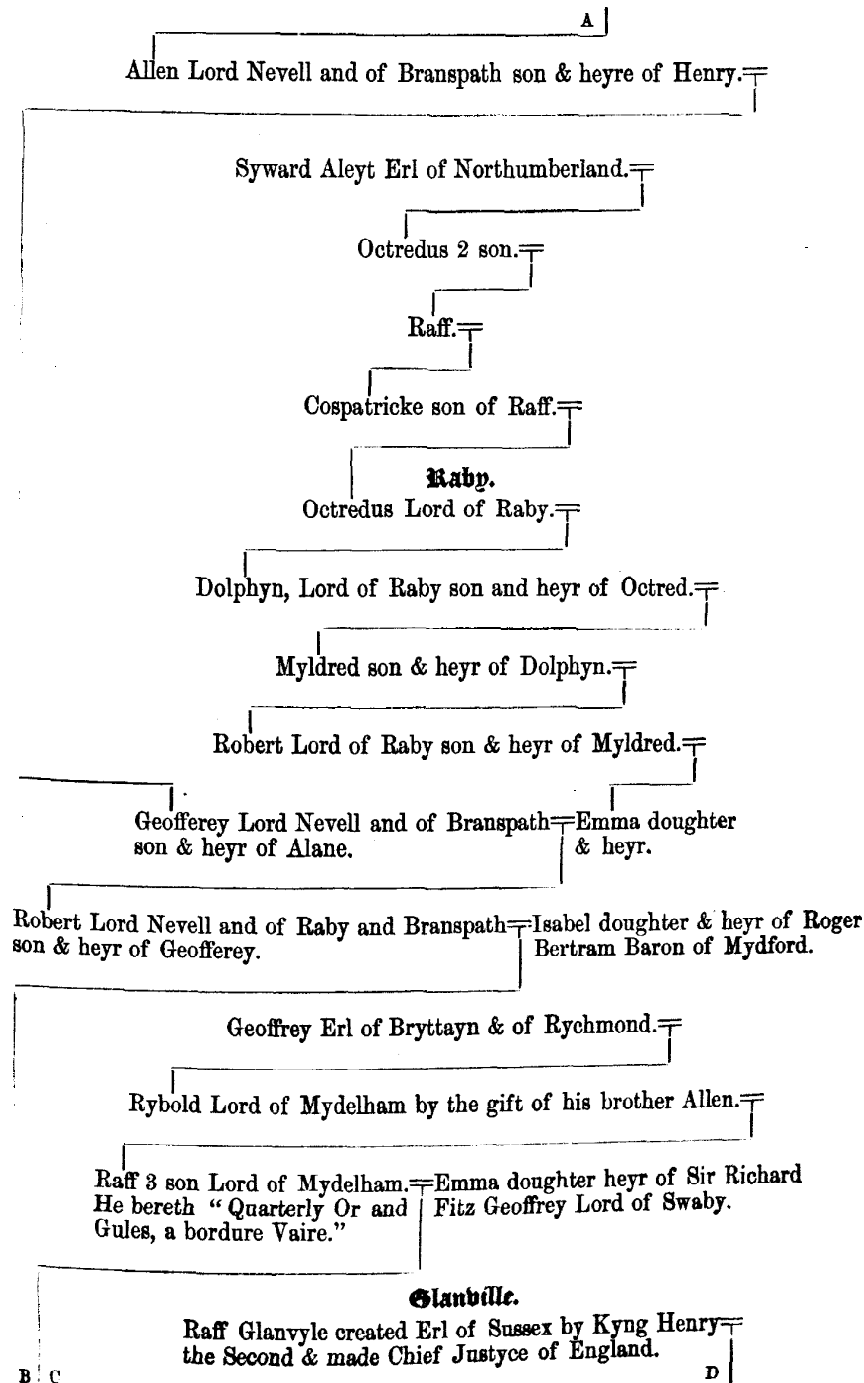
* Thomazyn is said on f. 130 to have married Tempest of Batley.

None of these Nevilles were "Lord Nevell"; they had modest holdings in Lincs and peerage titles like this had not been invented.



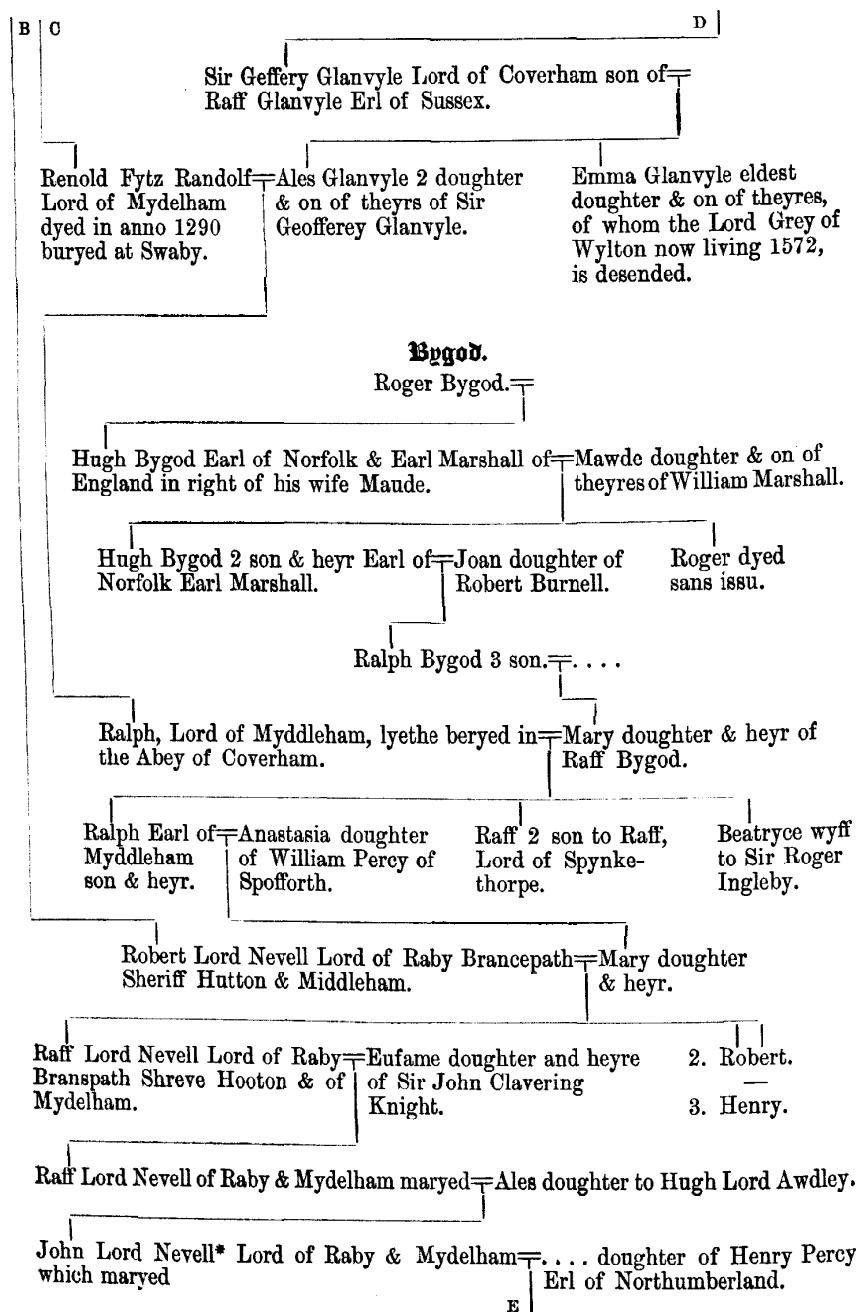
Corrections

The continuous male line descent for three generations at the top of this page is false. Delete Alan, and Geoffrey; replace with Isabella, dau and eventual heir of Geoffrey Neville and Emma Bulmer; Isabella married Robert son of Maldred, Lord of Raby, and had Geoffrey as their eldest son, whose wife was Joan.

Delete the first four generations of the Raby line: Syward, Octredus, Raff and Gospatricke; insert Maldred as the father of Octredus or Uchtred.

Ida, not Isabel, the wife of Robert Neville, son of Geoffrey and Joan, was the widow of Roger Bertram, not his daughter. In any case she was not the mother of Robert, that was an unnamed first wife.

The father of Rybald of Middleham was Eudo, count of Brittany and Rybald was illegitimate. His line then went: Ralph, Ralph, Robert, Ralph, Ralph and Mary who married Robert Neville son of Robert and N.N.

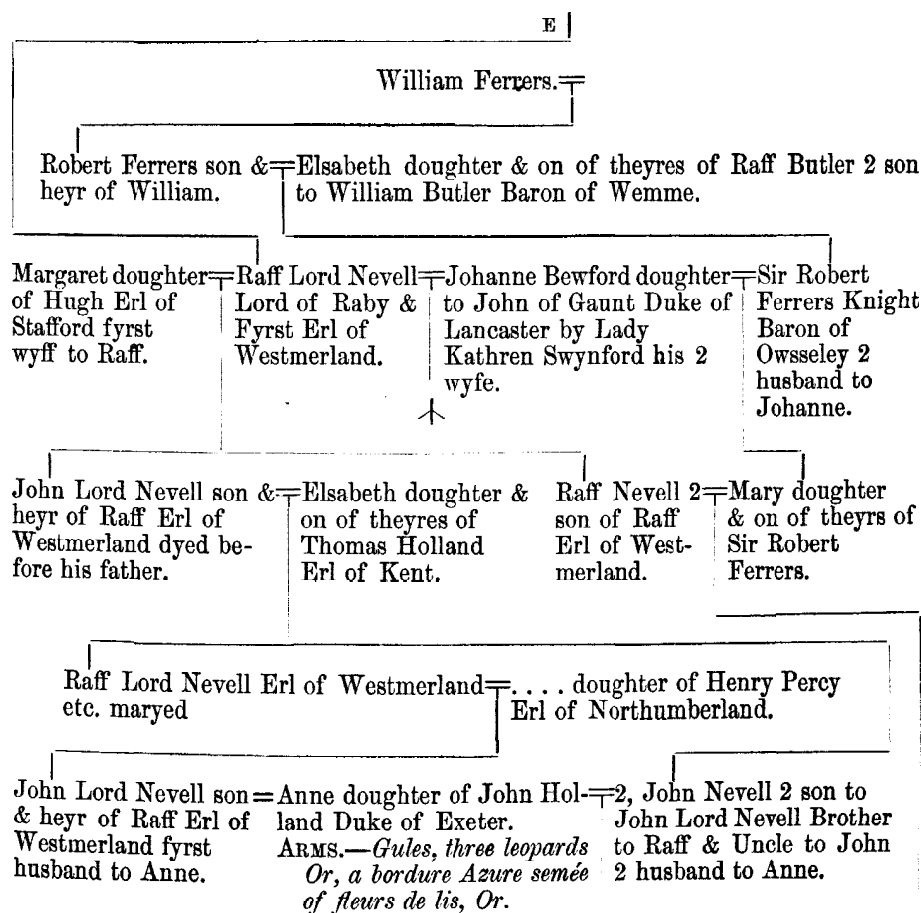

The Bigod line was Roger, Hugh earl, Roger earl, Mary who m. Ralph de Middleham.

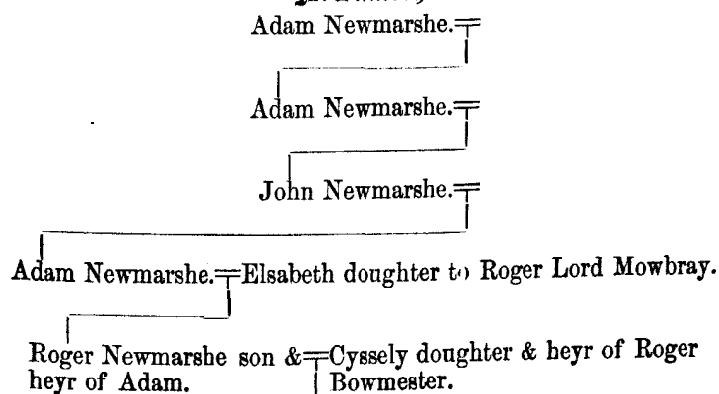

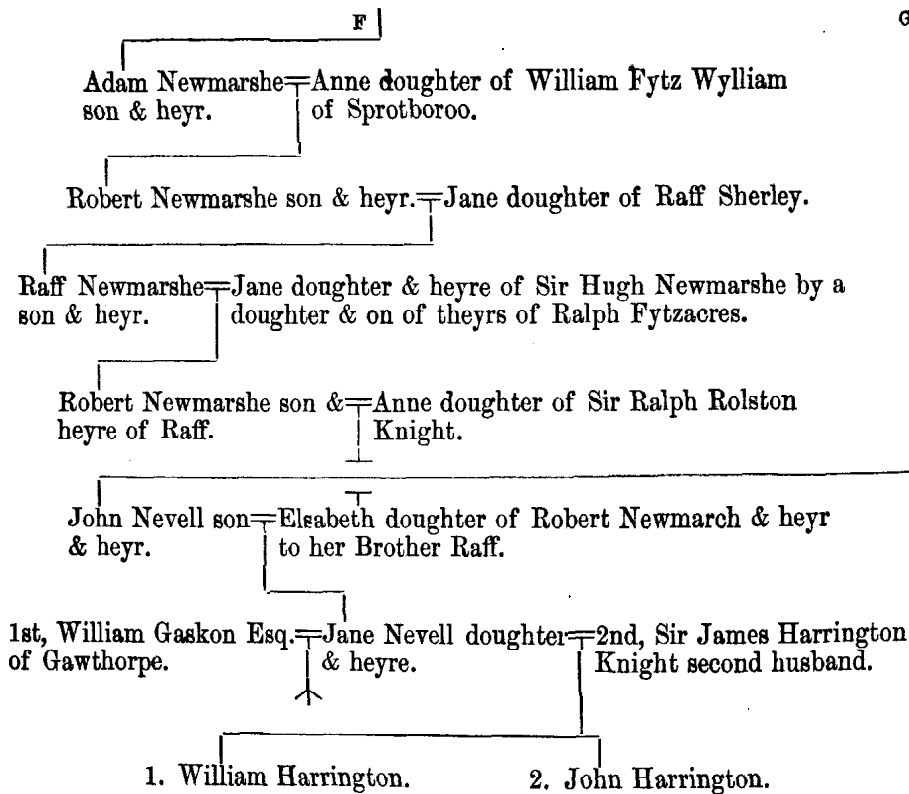

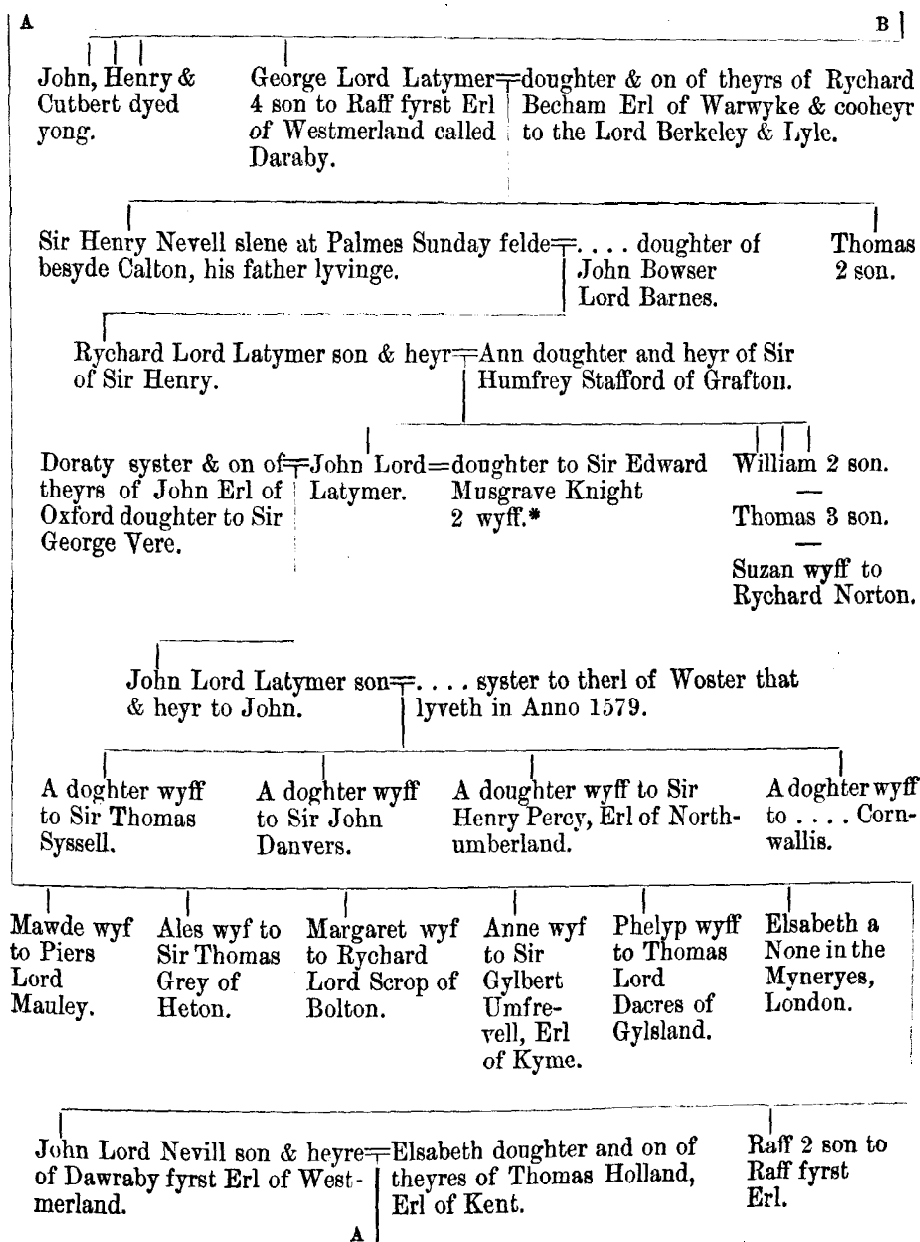

* Miss Agnes Strickland says ('Queens of England,' 1845, Vol. V., p. 16) that Elizabeth, daughter of Sir *Richard* Musgrave, was Lord Latimer's *first* wife, being married to him at Snape 20 July 1518. but had no issue: whereas the date is 20 June 1528. ('York Wills,' III., p. 374.) She was the second wife, and daughter of Sir Edward Musgrave. The first wife, Dorothy Vere, died 7 February 1526-7, and has a monumental inscription at Hornby. His will is dated 12 Sept. 1542, and was proved 11 March 1542-3. The 16 January previous he was living, and was summoned to Parliament. It is singular that this Visitation does not notice his third wife, Katherine Parr, born 1513, married 1533, died 7 Sept. 1548, the sixth and last wife of King Henry the Eighth. His son John died 23 April 1577, and was buried at Hornby the 10 June, his widow Lucy being buried at Hackney. She died 23 February 1582-3. 'Some Notices of St. John's, Hackney,' R. Simpson, 1879, pages 55-61.

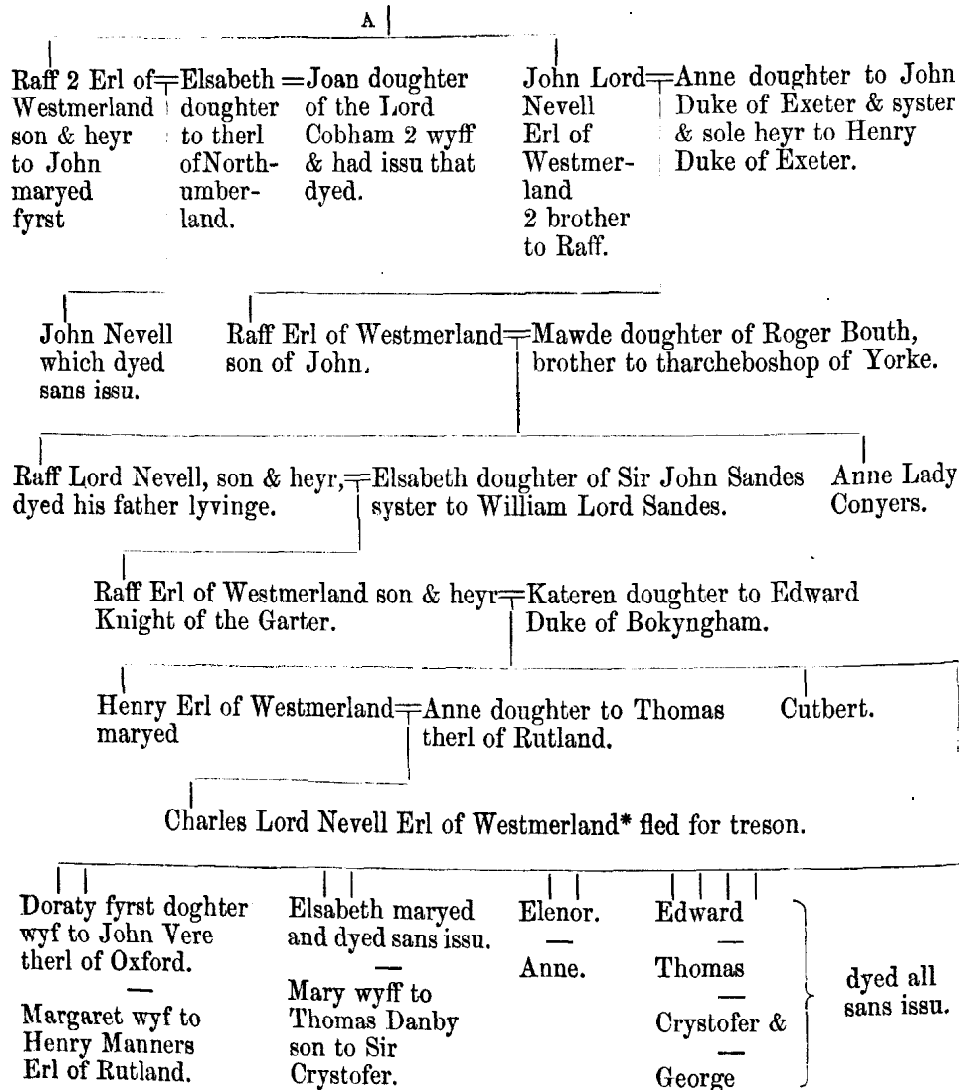

The wife of Henry Neville was Joan Bouchier dau. of John Bourcheir lord Berners.

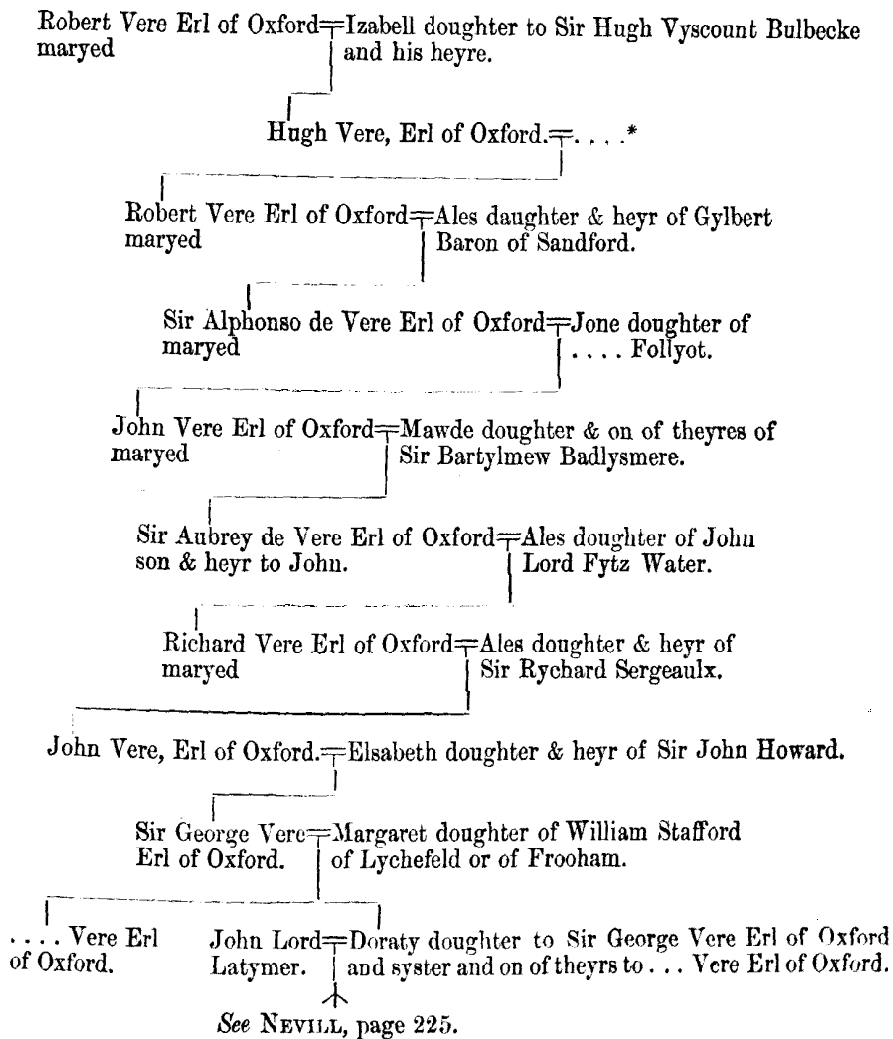
The wife of the last John Neville lord Latimer was Lucy Somerset, dau. of Henry earl of Worcester and Elizabeth Browne.



* Charles, Earl of Westmerland, had three sisters—Eleanor, wife of Sir William Pelham, Kt.; Katherine, wife of Sir John Constable of Halsbam, co. York, Knight; and Adeline, who had £50 a year allowed her by King James, 25 June 1604, and who made her will 22 March 1612-13. The Earl had four daughters, of whom the second, Eleanor, died unmarried before 25 June 1604, on which day the King granted an annuity of 200 marks per annum each to Catherine, Margaret, and Anne Neville. The first married Sir Thomas Grey of Chillingham, the second Nicholas Padsey, the third David Ingleby of Ripley, co. York, who died in 1617, leaving four daughters and coheirs.
